SUNDAY SCHOOL OUTLINE

Our Sunday School Outline for **December 11**, **2022**, **Zechariah Speaks is from Luke 1:57-66**, **76-79** Our Lesson Focus: **Teach others to glorify the Most High.**

After Zechariah's speech was restored, his first words were to praise God! In glorifying God, Zechariah taught that God was worthy of all praise. Our speech and behavior can teach others to glorify God. John the Baptist is known as the cousin of Jesus. John and Jesus had in common a deep frustration with religious and political leaders who ignored God's guidelines for justice and righteous living. We can be taught to put our trust in God and to glorify our Savior and Lord by Bible reading and church-going which helps us to live righteously and to pass our faith on to others.

- *Who in your life has been an example and taught you to trust and glorify God?
- *What does it mean to glorify God?
- *How does reading Scripture prepare us to teach others about God?

Our first scripture reading: The Birth of John the Baptist is from Luke 1:57-61

- *Why was there a great celebration when John was born?
- *Why did the crowd question Elizabeth's choice of a name for the baby?

Our second scripture reading: **Zechariah Speaks is from Luke 1:62-66**

- *What happened when Zechariah confirmed the name of the baby as John?
- *What was the crowd's response to the priest's sudden ability to speak again?

Our third scripture reading: **Zechariah's Prediction is from Luke 1:76-79**

- *What was the title that Zechariah predicted his son would be called?
- *How did Zechariah describe his son's eventual ministry?

Our last story – **Bringing Glory to God** – reminds us that John was born for a specific purpose: to prepare people's hearts for the Messiah's message of repentance and salvation. We have a similar purpose – our mission in life is to help people become ready or able to receive the good news of Jesus' sacrificial death for our sins and the offer of reconciliation to God. Once Zechariah regained his speech, he praised and glorified God. One way we can glorify God is to point out to others the amazing things God has done in our lives.

- *What can we do to help people become ready (prepared) to receive the good news about God's Messiah?
- *Why is it important to accept God and His Word that He will do what He says He will do?
- *What does our ministry as believers have in common with John's God-ordained mission?
- *How has God's mercy, compassion, plan of salvation, and restoration made a difference in your life?

Zechariah taught others that the Lord is God Most High who does things we don't believe will happen. Reflect on how you might teach others to praise and glorify God and why.



WEEKLY DEVOTION

Joy

This Sunday we will light the Joy advent candle. For weeks I have been thinking about the great hymn, "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee." Ludwig van Beethoven composed the music (Ninth Symphony) and Henry van Dyke penned the lyrics. Have you ever taken time to read the words? If not, it is page one in our church hymnal. I encourage you to read all the verses. There is deep theology in the lyrics.

Just reading the first verse gets my heart fluttering:

"Joyful, joyful, we adore Thee
God of glory, Lord of love;
Hearts unfold like flowers before Thee,
Opening to the sun above.
Melt the clouds of sin and sadness,
Drive the dark of doubt away;
Giver of immortal gladness,
Fill us with the light of day."

Joy is something that we only find in Jesus. I pray that you know the Author and Giver of joy. The joy He gives doesn't go away when times get bad. The joy He gives stays with you when circumstances aren't exactly what you expect. The joy He gives doesn't evaporate like the feelings of the one that says, "I don't love you anymore."

Jesus is our joy. He is real joy.

You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand. Psalm 16:11

Take time this season to thank God for the JOY He gives.
