

# **SUNDAY SCHOOL OUTLINE**

Our Sunday School Outline for June 26, 2022: God Offers Deliverance is from Isaiah 51:1-8 Our Lesson Focus: Listen to the Lord! He is righteous and brings deliverance.

There are always challenges. Today we will see some of the struggles that Israel faced and how Isaiah encouraged them to seek the Lord and remember His faithfulness. Even in the midst of trial, God's righteousness and salvation will ultimately last forever, through all generations. God promised the Israelites that their ruined cities would be rebuilt, that their desolate land would flourish, and that joy and singing would once again be heard in it. He also promised a world characterized by righteousness and justice. Waiting for God to fulfill His promises requires patience. We should start really listening for what the Lord has to say.

\*What are some means through which the Lord speaks to us?

\*What are some ways we sometimes respond to what we hear from Him?

\*What would make us better listeners?

Our first scripture reading: Your Land Will Be Restored is from Isaiah 51:1-3

\*Who was God addressing in this passage?

\*What was He promising?

\*What did the Israelites need to remember if they had doubts about this?

Our second scripture reading: My Justice Will Reign is from Isaiah 51:4-6

\*What would the Israelites long for?

\*When will what they long for be realized?

\*How certain was this?

Our third scripture reading: Your Enemies Will Be Devoured is from Isaiah 51:7-8

\*What would the Israelites experience as they waited to be delivered?

\*What was going to happen to their enemies?

\*How did God want His people to respond to this?

Our last story - **Are You Talking to Me?** - makes us wonder that when we hear from the Lord if He is really speaking to us individually. We often think we know which direction in our life is the right way; then we come to realize we would have been better off if we had listened to God in the first place. It pays to listen to God and trust in His promises.

\*What are some ways God had spoken to you in the past? How did you respond?

\*Have there been times when you failed to listen to God or trust what He had to say? If so, what was the result?

\*What have you learned from this?

Hearing from God requires spending more time in His Word, in listening intently to others, or in setting aside time in quiet so we can hear His voice. Then we need to respond affirmatively to what we are hearing from Him.

# **WEEKLY DEVOTION**

#### **Fight the Good Fight**

As I write today, it's the first day of summer. It just happens to be my favorite time of year. The flowers are blooming, warm weather persists, everything is green, lush and beautiful. All is well. We have our yard in good shape, vegetables planted, porches decorated and the deck furniture set to be used for dinner or a time of relaxation.

Then, you realize that a squirrel has dug up the sprouting vegetables, the chipmunks are wreaking havoc with your potted flowers, and the deer are devouring the blooms on your perennial shrubs and flowering plants. The varmints are ruining your paradise and your peace. We fight them like mad to win back our property, plants, and place we love so much.

Just like those varmints in our yards, sin sneaks in and steals our joy. It may be obvious or it may come in increments. Nevertheless, sin is a killer, destroyer, and invader of the holiness of our souls. And just like those varmints previously mentioned, we have to fight!

So what do we do to fight spiritually?

We submit ourselves to God and resist the devil: James 4:7 - **Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.** 

We stay in God's Word: Psalm 119:-10-11 - I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.

#### We pray and have fellowship with God:

1 Corinthians 1:9 - God is faithful, who has called you into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

and

I Peter 5:7 - Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

We fight the good fight: I Timothy 6:11-12 - But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

We stand firm: Ephesians 6:10-18 - Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

I could go on, but you get my point. Friends, fight the varmint of sin. Stand firm! Use God's armor that is available to you. Resist and overcome!

Thank you, Lord, for Your power over sin. Thank you for providing the tools we need to keep fighting and resist sin in every way. You are great! You are good! You are holy! Be glorified in our lives, Lord! Be glorified in our church, Lord! May our lives reflect You at all times! In the powerful name of Jesus, our Redeemer we pray. Amen!
