SUNDAY SCHOOL OUTLINE

Our Sunday School Outline for November 21, 2021, **Rejoicing in Heaven is from Revelation 19:1-8**

Our Lesson Focus: **Hallelujah! Celebrate the Lamb who loves His bride.**

Christ's love for His bride, the Church, is all about love. He gave His life for the Church – His Bride – and we need to make ourselves ready for His return. We are forgiven by the precious blood of the Lamb. We need to obey Him, serve Him, praise Him, and bring more into His kingdom. Revelation 19:1-8 reminds us that our future in paradise will be a time of much rejoicing and abundant praise for the Lord. Jesus comes to us in all the muck and mire and mess of our lives. But, He doesn't force Himself upon us. What He really values is our heart and our love for Him.

*Why is a wedding a time to celebrate?

*How is celebrating what Jesus has done for you like celebrating at a wedding?

*Do you celebrate what Jesus has done for you throughout the day no matter what kind of day you are having?

Explain your answer.

Our first scripture reading: **Spontaneous Praise is from Revelation 19:1-3**

*What is the significance of the fact that the praise for the Lord is spontaneous among those in heaven?

*Why is the multitude crying out with hallelujahs at the Lord's destruction of an earthly kingdom?

Our second scripture reading: **Worship Before God's Throne is from Revelation 19:4-5**

*How do the 24 elders and four living creatures express their worship of God?

Our third scripture reading: **Loud and Jubilant Celebration is from Revelation 19:6-8**

*How does John describe the praise he heard while in heaven?

*What are the "righteous acts" of God's people represented by the "fine linen" that they wore?

He Loves His Bride! – In Ephesians 5:25, we read: "Husbands, love your wives just as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her..." We are part of the Bride that Christ loves with all His heart. Christ's love for His Bride runs so deep that it is overwhelmingly pure, and draws us to Him. Jeremiah 31:3 reminds us of our Savior's deep everlasting love and His unfailing kindness.

*Why is a groom marrying his bride a good metaphor for Christ loving His Church?

*What examples of deep and abiding love have you seen between a bride and groom?

*Why is the Scripture about Christ loving the Church as much as a husband loves his bride important to remember?

Be thankful the Lamb of God loves us! Be glad we are the bride of Christ! We have an honor and privilege to be chosen. Be thankful for His sacrifice and commitment. Psalm 34:1 "I will bless the LORD at all times: His praise shall continually be in my mouth." We should celebrate and consistently praise Him for all He has done and all He continues to do.



WEEKLY DEVOTION


